OPENING ACCLAMATION

with your whole heart, your neighbor as yourself, until your life's end?

Marshall: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Family of Good Shepherd, will you witnessing these vows encourage, strengthen,

and pray for Marshall in his life in Christ?

Celebrant: Therefore in joyful obedience to Your Son, we bring into His fellowship Marshall who comes to Him in faith, baptizing him in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now, Father, sanctify this water by the power of the Holy Spirit, and grant that Marshall baptized here may be cleansed from sin and continue forever faithful in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior; to whom, with You, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, world without end. THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

Celebrant: Almighty God, Owner of all things, we thank You for giving up Your only Son to die on the cross for us who owe You everything. Pour Your refreshing Spirit on us and upon these gifts as we remember Him in the way He commanded, through these gifts of Your creation.

On the same night that He was betrayed He took bread and gave You thanks; He broke it and gave it to His disciples saying, "Take, eat; this is My body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me."

Amen. His body was broken for us.
